The enrolment agencies who are already working with the State Government will not divert their current deployed operators and enrolment kits to the India Post operations.
- f) India Post will strictly monitor the activities of its enrolment agencies and ensure control over malpractices such as sale of enrolment forms, out-of-turn priority for enrolment (tatkal) on payment, opening of enrolment centers outside the India Post premises, operator poaching, etc.

Subject: 3rd party inspections of UID Enrolment Centers by YASHADA

This is in reference to the inspections to be carried out at the Aadhaar enrolment centers.

2. It is required that random inspections/checks be done of the enrolment centers to ensure that the Enrolment Agencies are complying to the defined processes / procedures (in some of the checks done earlier, it was observed that agencies are not following the SoP, outsourcing the work done, not aware that priority is to be given to elderly people, differently abled and pregnant ladies etc., forms were not readily available for free).
3. In light of the above, State Government has engaged YASHADA, the premier administrative training organisation of Government of Maharashtra, to undertake 3rd party inspections of UID enrolment centers across the State. YASHADA has been deeply involved with Aadhaar program. As part of this engagement, YASHADA would be submitting the inspection reports directly to Secretary – IT. During the course of this engagement, YASHADA would be visiting enrolment centers and monitor the compliances towards:
 - a) The standards & guidelines, as suggested by UIDAI and State Government are being followed
 - b) Availability of certified operators & supervisors at enrolment centers/stations
 - c) Availability of adequate stationary & other logistics at centers
 - d) Availability of adequate backup arrangement at enrolment centers
 - e) Remedial / Corrective measures taken in case of process/ quality deviations & grievance redressal
 - f) Successful data transfer to CIDR

4. In light of the above, YASHADA team would contact you to plan their inspections of the enrolment centers in your region. You are requested to provide necessary support to the YASHADA team during the inspection of the enrollment centers.

Subject: Guidelines for Aadhaar enabled Pilot Projects


The State Government along with UIDAI has planned to focus on Aadhaar based authentication and applications to ensure that benefits of the project reach the intended beneficiary. To finalize the same, a meeting was convened by Hon. Chief Minister Shri. Prithviraj Chavan on 17th Feb 2012, and was attended by Shri. Nandan Nilekani, Hon. Chairman, UIDAI; Shri Ratnakar Gaikwad, Chief Secretary – Govt. of Maharashtra; Shri. Rajesh Aggarwal, Secretary IT and Secretaries of departments with citizen centric services and having large number of beneficiaries. 8 Pilot Projects and locations for Pilot were finalized during the said meeting.

2. To facilitate the implementation of the Pilot projects, UID enrolment can be carried out in the pilot locations for the target beneficiary only. A Government verifier needs to be positioned in each of the enrolment center for verifying the documents being submitted for enrolment. A detailed guideline to be followed, including the list of projects, pilot location, target beneficiary group, enrolment agencies to conduct the enrolment etc. is enclosed.

3. You are requested to kindly go through the guidelines, convene a meeting with the enrolment agencies and other project stakeholders at the earliest and commence work on the UID enrolment on a priority. The enrolments for the pilot project needs to be completed within 45 days from commencement.

Subject: Reg. Phase II of UID enrolment in Maharashtra

Dear Sir/ Madam,

As you are aware, the phase II of the UID enrolment is expected to commence across the State from 1st May 2012. In Phase II, the State Government and UIDAI has brought in certain changes in the enrolment process which is aimed at further strengthening the enrolment process and simplifying the process of management and monitoring. Some of the key changes are:

1. Enrolment Centers can be set up only on approval of the Registrar (Municipal Commissioner or District Collector) and after updating the details in the UIDAI Portal
2. No Registrar data packet and KYR+ data to be collected in enrolment
3. GPS device to be added at every enrolment center by the EA to capture the location coordinates
4. Presence of Govt. verifiers to be mandatory at all centers

2. The State Government has released a tender for appointment of enrolment agencies for phase II of UID enrolment, and we would inform you next week regarding the name of the agencies which would be working in your region. Once you have received the names of the agencies selected, you may call them for a meeting to start the enrolment for your region by 1st May.

3. As part of the background work for Phase II of the enrolment, you are requested to initiate the following processes at your end at the earliest:

1. Finalize the locations for enrolment centers in your region

2. Appoint 3 Govt. verifiers (can be in-service or retired Govt. staff) per center who needs to be present at the centers during the time of enrolment The verifiers would be paid as per the Govt. GR in this regard and the fund for the same shall be provided by DIT, Govt. of Maharashtra

4. Please feel free to get in touch with us for any additional information that may be needed.



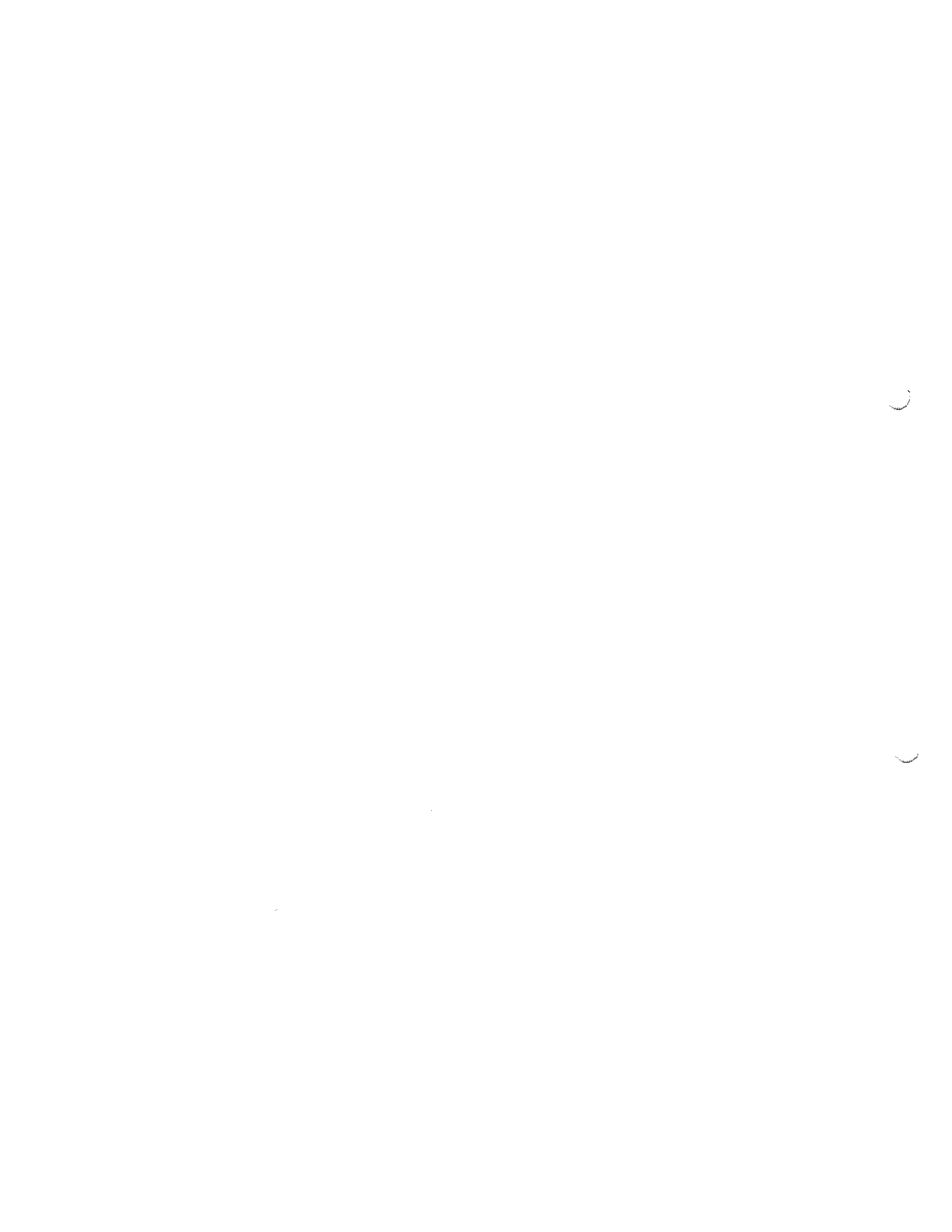

Dear Sir/ Madam,

As you are aware, the second phase of UID Enrolment was inaugurated on May 18th 2012 in Maharashtra. DIT, Govt. of Maharashtra has appointed 10 agencies for UID Enrolment in the State and the agencies have initiated the enrolment process. We have received letters from various Registrars (Dist. Collector/ Municipal Commissioner) seeking clarifications on area/zone wise distribution of wards to the Agencies for UID Enrolment, role of Non State Registrars and location of enrolment.

2. Although the details regarding the above had been earlier communicated through individual letters, however, considering the various clarifications which has been sought, it may be prudent to explain the same again

3. Time-bound enrolment is of prime important to the State and we look forward to completion of maximum enrolments by March 2012. Considering the same, in case any of the agency appointed by the State Government for your schedule is not able to deploy sufficient number of machines, you may ask the remaining agencies for your district to put in additional machines. This is to ensure that no inconvenience is caused to the residents of that region in enrolling themselves for UID.

4. Various Non State Registrars like Public Sector Banks, India Post, NSDL etc. have also been allowed to conduct UID enrolment in Maharashtra through their enrolment agencies. In case the enrolment is being conducted in or near their branch premises, then no prior approval of the District Collector/Municipal Commissioner shall be needed and they would just need to inform the District Collector/Municipal Commissioner of the locations for enrolment. In case the Non State Registrars are planning to conduct enrolment outside their branch premises, then prior approval may be needed from the District Collector/Municipal Commissioner. Approvals may be granted to them as per the requirement in the districts to speed up the total enrolment.

6. It is also directed that, enrolments may also be done in Housing Societies, Corporates and Education institutions which are not related to political establishments in Municipal Corporation areas. The enrolment agencies shall update the address of these Housing Societies, Corporates and Educational Institutions in the QAMIS Portal and get them activated before starting enrolment. The information for the same needs to be provided to the concerned Registrar (Municipal Commissioner) and UIDAI RO.

With reference to the above subject and revised guidelines received from UIDAI (Ref. No. 1), I am directed to inform that the appointment of the govt. verifiers is now not mandatory for the UID enrolments being carried out by the enrolment agencies. The Supervisors of the enrolment agencies are eligible to act as verifiers during the enrolment process and are required to play the role of the verifier by following all the guidelines of the State Government and UIDAI. The enrolment agency is required to ensure that the Supervisors are adequately trained to handle the role of a Verifier.

2. The Registrars (Dist. Collectors/ Municipal Commissioners) may review and audit the enrolment work being carried out at the centers at regular interval to ensure that authentic and secure enrolments are done at enrolment centers.

This is in reference to the above mentioned subject. As per the UIDAI guidelines, the packets must be uploaded by the EAs within 20 days of enrollment. The delay in upload may cause a risk of loss or compromise of critical resident data and result in inconvenience to the residents and shall be considered as a willful act of negligence on your part.

2. It has been constantly observed that many of the enrolment agencies are not uploading the packets within the given timeframe, which is unacceptable. This results in

additional effort on part of the Registrar and Regional office in facilitating approval of the exception and results in delay in generation of UID. Annexure I has been enclosed which gives the status of packet upload vis-a-vis enrollments done by respective agencies.

3. It is hereby directed that all EA's clear the pending enrollment packets before 11th October 2012. Further, all packets need to be uploaded by them on-time and requests for uploading the packets after the stipulated timeframe shall not be accepted. In such cases, penalties may be levied on the EAs for this willful negligence, delay and deficiency in service.

Subject: Allowing Enrolment Agencies to work in additional Schedules matching L1 Rates

Dear Sir/ Madam

With reference to the Phase II of UID Enrolments in Maharashtra and to complete maximum enrolments by March 2013, nearly 5000 kits are needed to be deployed in the State. However, since the total number of kits deployed till date is much lesser than required at present, State may allow any of the remaining 9 agencies except M/s Glodyne Technoserve Ltd, to match the L1 Rates in any schedule where they can put in additional kits and start the enrolment process in those schedules.

2. The remaining 9 agencies may accordingly express their willingness to match the L1 Rates and the number of kits they can deploy in those schedules before 5.00 pm on 5th October 2012 and start the enrolment process in these schedules after approval from State Govt. The agencies may be allowed to match L1 prices even in those schedules even if they had not bid in that schedule earlier.

3. Post allocation of new schedules to the enrolment agencies showing their willingness to match L1 rates and deployment of kits, the State Govt. may take the review of the agencies by 12th October 2012 and if State finds that there is further scope of addition of kits to complete enrolment within the prescribed timeframe, the State may

consider inviting all other F3,F4 category enrolment agencies which had not bid earlier and F1 and F2 category of agencies which were not considered for the earlier tender. The agencies need to work at the L1 rates only and shall be based on technical evaluation (on T1 basis) based on their readiness and availability of kits.

4. Hence, it is requested to submit your willingness on matching L1 Rates in the required schedules.

Subject: Setting up enrolment centers by Non-State Registrars

Ref:

- 1) UIDAI Letter with Ref. No.: A-11016/75/2010

Dear Sir/ Madam

With reference to the above subject, State Govt. has revised the process of allocation of enrolment centers to Non State Registrars as per the guidelines of UIDAI (Ref. No.1) and based on the need to accelerate the ramp up of enrolment kits. Non State Registrar can set up enrolment centers through their enrolment agencies by updating the QAMIS Portal of UIDAI and informing the District Collector/ Municipal Commissioner. No prior approval will be needed for the same.

2. However, Non State Registrar need to take adequate precaution to ensure that **no camp is set up in offices of political parties, political premises, religious premises or any other such premise which may be biased towards any particular sect. Camps should be setup in premises which are neutral in nature and wherein residents can have easy access.** It shall be the sole responsibility of the Non State Registrar to obtain any approval from the owner of the premises whose premise is being used for enrolment.

3. District Collectors and Municipal Commissioners should use services of M/s Yashada and M/s Mahaonline Limited for conducting random surveys of enrolment centers using the Android based survey application to ensure proper supervision.

4. Going forward, all Divisional Commissioners, Dist. Collectors and Municipal Commissioners should also focus on data seeding and linking various schemes with UID which can result in suitable benefit to citizens.
